After completing their first year, the new teachers can now learn fom their mistakes and are proud to see how their students have grown and prospered due to their inciteful teaching methods.



Although having the bright lights helped some students, like




















#### Fritzy Goes to Semi-State




Leading the way for the M-G wrestling team was, in fact, a trilogy. Two of the three captains, also known as the 'Deadly Duo', were senior John Inglis and junior Matt Roberts. The third wrestler of the trilogy was senior Trace Fritz, not a captain but a huge part in leading the team. John Inglis led the team with 15 pins, a career high. John wrestled for six years and accomplished much his senior year. "My greatest accomplishment would have to be that I went my whole senior year, and I became 'unpinnable'...No one could pin me...I'm just that good." John finished his senior wrestling career with a 21-11 record, second place in Grant Four, third place in CIC, fifth place in sectionals and captain of the wrestling team for two years.

Next Lord of the Ring was Matt Roberts. Matt was a captain for two years. He accomplished second in Grant Four, second in CIC, third in Sectionals, and qualified for Regionals. Matt wrestled for five years and looked forward to his senior year. "I can't wait for my rematch with Nick Shepard from Mississenewa," said Matt. His other goals include going to Semi-State, like his teammate Trace, and not being pinned, like his 'Deadly Duo' partner John.

Going to Semi-State was Senior Trace Fritz's greatest accomplishment. "Walking into Ft. Wayne Coliseum knowing I have to wrestle in front of hundreds of people," was Trace's most memorable moment. Trace tied for first in Grant Four, placed fourth in Sectionals, placed third in Regionals, and was a Semi-State qualifier.

Wrestling in Spandex isn't always a bad thing. "We get to dominate on the mat and show off our hot bodies at the same time...who wouldn't want to wrestle?" said the Deadly Duo.




































# Homecoming

As the week wrapped up, the day turned into night, the temperature dropped, and the rain poured, while the Argylls got warmed up for the much anticipated football game.


The crowd grew bigger-by the minute with dedicated fans standing in the rain, pushing their fellow Argylls to victory.






