a new roof on the bldg. and it was moved a motion carried that we advertise for bids for reroofing with ^{the purpose of} ~~the purpose of~~ ^{replacing} all beds. This to be done after our financial condition is thoroughly ascertained.

Mr. Reich asked about shutters on the lot.

The bills were read & allowed.

A motion carried that the money given by the conference leader who used the bid room be divided between the light bills & the janitress - the bills getting ten & the janitress five dollars.
