The Prom was held at the Kokomo Armory, with Chip McClelland's band providing excellent music. Our Homecoming attendant was Pat Monahan. For class sponsors we had Mr. Gene Collins, Miss Linda Scott, and Mr. Douglas Naylor.
was "The Man Who Came to Dinner," directed by Glenn Crane. We ordered our class rings from Herff-Jones and received them in December. Our sponsors were Mr. Orville Long, Mrs. Joe Bennett, and Mr. Douglas Naylor. A senior Vesper Service was held December 14 at the Wesleyan Methodist Church. Mr. Paul Horine was the speaker for the well-filled church.

Senior pictures were taker by Gayle Tutterow during the month of July 1960. A class party was held to construct a float for the Homecoming parade. For money-making projects we sold magazines and worked in the Breeze Booth. Thelma Scudi and Karen Elliott received awards for their high salesmanship. Our class play was "Andy Hardy" by Aurania Rouverll. It was presented November 3 and 4 , under the direction of Mrs . Adeline Nall. Karen Chapel was our Homecoming Queen and Donna Chidester was senior attendant. Queen candidate for the Valentine Hop was Virginia Stitt, and the outstanding honor of Betty Crocker Homemaker of Tomorrow was won by Lora Nell Spence.

The Seniors took a trip to Chicago from April 14 to 17 . We all enjoyed the Prom the Juniors gave on March 30. Baccalaureate Services were held May 14. The following Monday graduation services were held. The speaker was James Huston, a History Professor from Purdue and a Fairmount High School graduate in the class of ' 35 .

As we prepared this annual and wrote of these forthcoming events, we were a class of enthusiastic seniors anticipating the thrill of final graduating activities. Now, as we read about them here, they, too, have become history, and we are no longer students but happy alumni of 1961.
