



Pre-Algebra I and II, Algebra I, and geometry are the classes usually taken to meet requirements. Algebra II, trigonometry, analytic geometry, and pre-calculus are taken by college-bound students or students who have an interest in the math department.

Computer programming consists of studying the components of a computer system, programming a computer, and learning assorted graphics problems.







The science classes at M-G were full this year because many fields that students are preparing to enter require at least one year of science. Yet most students take three or four years for the challenge and to better prepare them for college.





English is divided into three main sections during high school — grammar, literature, and composition.

Throughout high school grammar teaches students extensive diagramming. Freshmen begin to learn important authors in American literature. Sophomores read a variety of plays and short stories. Juniors and seniors read many books and dramas, ranging from TOM SAW-YER and THE OLD MAN AND THE SEA to MACBETH and OTHELLO. Juniors spend a large part of the year perfecting composition skills by writing themes. By the end of their senior year, students have written about twenty themes. This writing is to prepare students better for college.

Speech II is an advanced class designed to teach the student how to debate and do research. In this class students expand their knowledge and advance their communication methods.










HEALTH





FOREIGN LANGUAGE

Learning a foreign language does not only consist of speaking the language. It also consists of learning about traditions and cultures of that country. Madison-Grant offers two foreign languages — Spanish and French.

During the course of the school year, students in Spanish I and French I spend many hours learning the basics. A few of the basics, which are a necessity in learning to speak fluently, are verbs, numbers, adjectives, time, and the days of the week. Colors, weather, clothing, and room vocabulary are a few extras that are learned throughout the year. The three goals of Spanish and French I are speaking, hearing, and writing.

Second year French and Spanish have main goals of improved writing and speaking more fluently. Throughout the year, students conjugate verbs and expand their vocabulary. A vocabulary of food, occupations, and animals may also be taught.

During the second semester, the students in French II and Spanish II have six weeks of teaching in the elementary classrooms. The studentteaching program allows the students to use what they have learned in their two years of class and to experience what it is like to have to teach those skills to elementary children.




HOME ECONOMICS



The Art Department offers seven creative art classes. Basic art is a general art class that introduces the students to all the various media which can be explored further in another art class.



Students take classes in industrial arts for many different reasons. Most students in this department take introduction to industrial arts. This class is a combined class of what they will learn if they take a future class in this department.






Faculty


The 1985-1986 Varsity Volleyball team started its practice in August to prepare for the '85 season. The Argylls worked hard on the fundamentals and teamwork.






The Madison-Grant Girls' Varsity Basketball team, dominated by juniors and sophomores, finished at 8-10 this year.

If the Argylls can find someone to take the place of departing senior Dana Rhoads, watch out, Marion.









But with 7 starters and 19 returning lettermen, the future looks bright for the Argylls.












M-G won their first dual meet in two years this season and finished second in three triangular meets.



A Night to Remember



The prom committee went to the Marion Inn at about 1:00 p.m. to decorate the pool room, where the prom was to be held.



At the after prom there were seventy pizzas provided by Little Caesar's Restaurant, and pop was also supplied.







Graduation








Construction
