## School Board Planned New School

The Madison-Grant United School Corporation was operated by a seven member interim school board. The 1965-66 members held office until June 30, 1966. The township advisory boards in each of the six townships in our district appointed one board member, and the Fairmount Town Board appointed the seventh member.

The 196̧-66 officers were: Walter Farley, President; Paul Baker, Vice-President; John Comer, Secretary; and Charles Yale, Treasurer. Other members were Harrold Forrest, John Hiatt, and Mary Waymire.

The regular board meetings were held on the second Monday of each month. This organization was important to our school system because it made, adopted, and enforced policies and rules for Fairmount and Summitville schools. The board made all the necessary plans for the new consolidated school.

In May of 1966 a permanent seven-member school board was elected by the six townships and the town of Fairmount. These members took office on July 1, 1966.
