Senior Tom Clark, in his final year in cross country, broke Elwood's record of $16: 31$ for a distance of 3.1 miles $(5,000$ meters.) Tom's new record is 16:11.
Tom, named outstanding runner for 1981, placed 8th in Sectional competition at Blackford October 17 and advanced to Regional October 24. where he placed 10th and then on to the Semi-state at Fort Wayne October 31.
