


















Come Cruise With The Juniors














Artists Degorate School



















Panthers Turn Losses Into Victories

our guys had got some of their confidence back. We never lost faith!






JV Football










Monday, February 27, the snow began to fall and it continued for the next three days on and off. By Friday we were able to put on the parkas and hiking boots and trudge out into the snow.







This year the band purchased new uniforms and thus had all kind of money-making projects.


The band improved a lot during this year and is now ready for the 1984-85 season.






A choir consisting of many seniors sang during Commencement with Julie Stout giving a solo performance.
