


For the 224 seniors of '78, May 25 was a triumphant yet sad moment.

















Trying to write something about the Senior Class seemed almost an impossible task even for us seniors. How do you describe your feelings toward your closest friends, along with the best times of your lives.

This year as the school year comes to a close, Mr. W. Blair Sullivan will retire after sixteen years as principal of E.C.H.S.

Mr. Sullivan began his career at Elwood in 1949 after graduating from Ball State with a bachelor's and master's degree in the Arts in Education with a major in biology. He also graduated with licenses for guidance and counseling, high school administration, and superintendency.

Mr. Sullivan taught biology at Wendell Willkie High where he also started the guidance and counseling department. While he was doing all this, he was also athletic director.

Later in 1961 he became assistant principal under M.A. Copeland, and in 1963 he was appointed principal at Wendell Willkie High.

Once the new high school was finished in 1973 he became the first principal to speak at graduation in the new high school.

In his thirty year career Mr. Sullivan has had many accomplishments and achievements, spending many long hours helping students, and trying to improve the school itself. We the students of Elwood Community High School commend him and wish him the very best in the future.

















The prospects are there for another outstanding season in 1979.














This year's Council earned more money than any recent group and put it to good use on the announcement board.




