Closing the show was the traditional ``Battle Hymn of the Republic.''






The foreign exchange students presented ribbons and wreaths to winners at the awards ceremony.











The Panthers lost many close games this year with the main problem being that they would jump out to the lead in the first half only to be overtaken in the third or fourth quarter.






Kirk Brenner shoots over his opponents.





Coach Bomholt stated, "The key to this team's success has been desire and a lot of hard work." The future of Panther basketball is counting on these talented freshmen.













Choir, this year under the new direction of Miss Paula Simmons, performed the yearly Christmas show for the public and at shows for the elementary and high schools.




