


Foreword





The first of July brought the downfall of the old Oak Grove building.






We Progress Toward The Future

At a later date, an open house was held for the public upon completion of the new Summitville school.















Beginning to think research can be fun? You're right. If you enjoyed your high school science courses, perhaps you should think about making a career in research. Don't get the idea that it'll be a snap, though. You'll need to tackle a lot of preparatory study and hard work in college. But if you've got what it takes, maybe we can get together sometime and play around with a new discovery or two.






