






Ready, set, ride! On October 29th, students and teachers piled into the gymnasium to participate in the 2nd annual donkey basketball competition.




Family Ties








Senior's Last Memories














Junior High football had another successful season under head coach Dennis Huntsinger. The seventh grade had a steller first year, and the eighth graders used their experience to win 6 games this season.
































