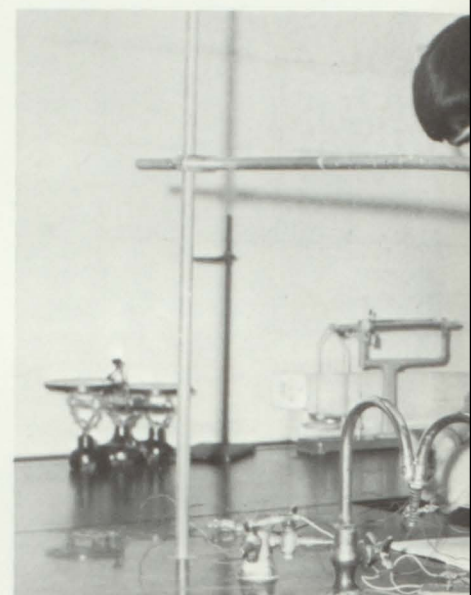

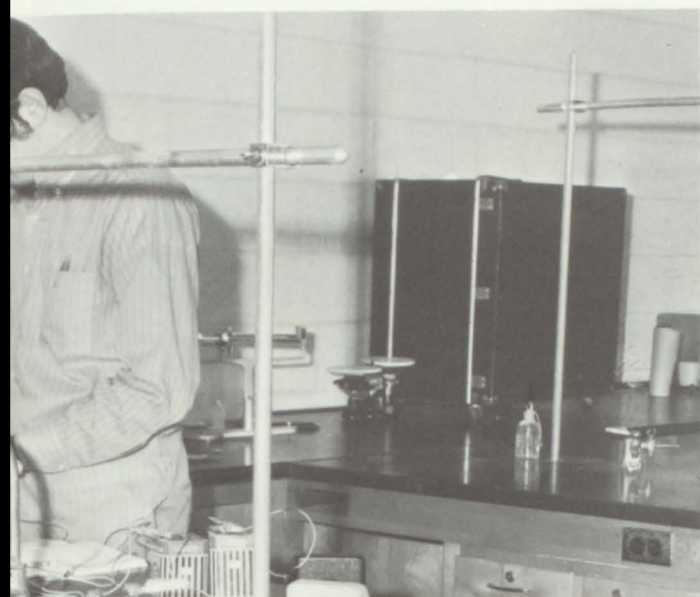

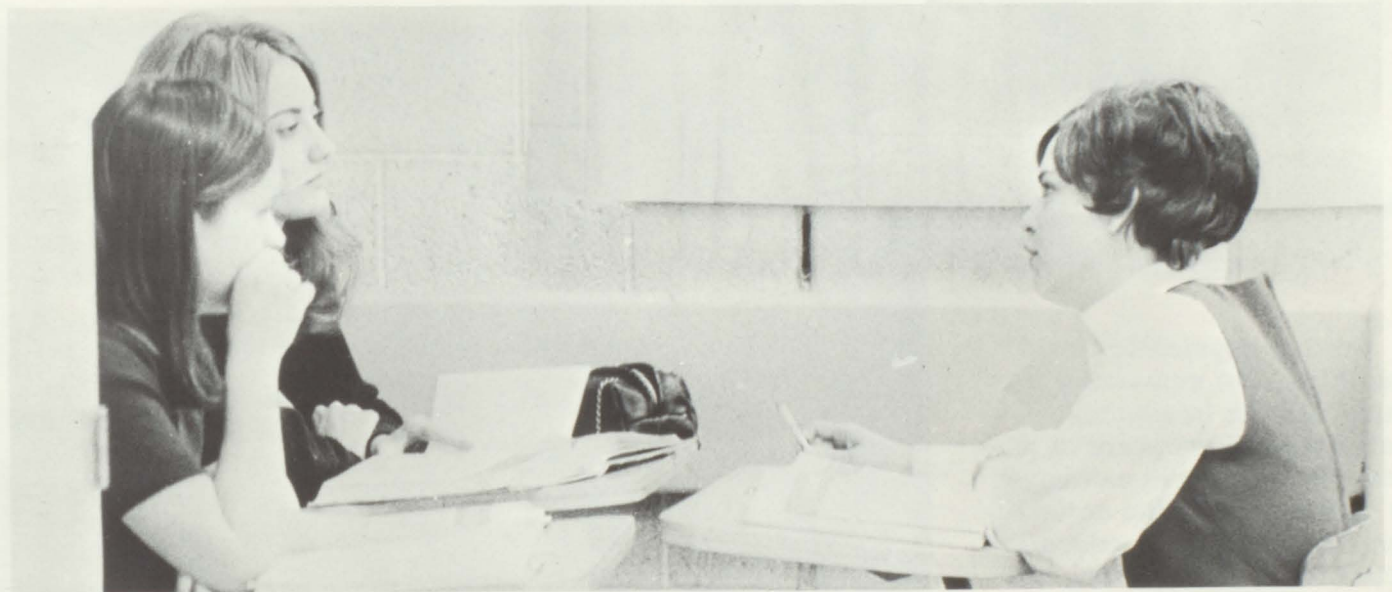

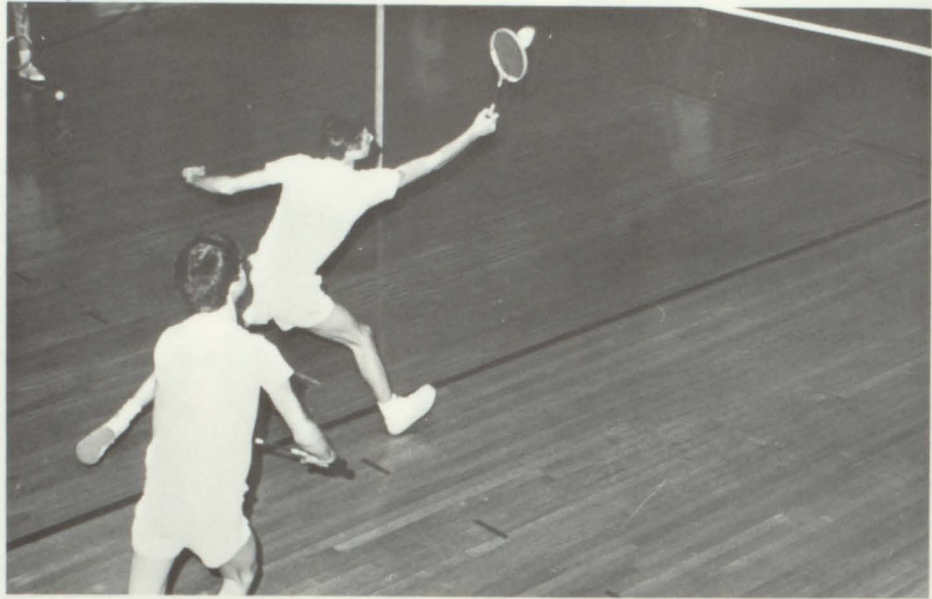

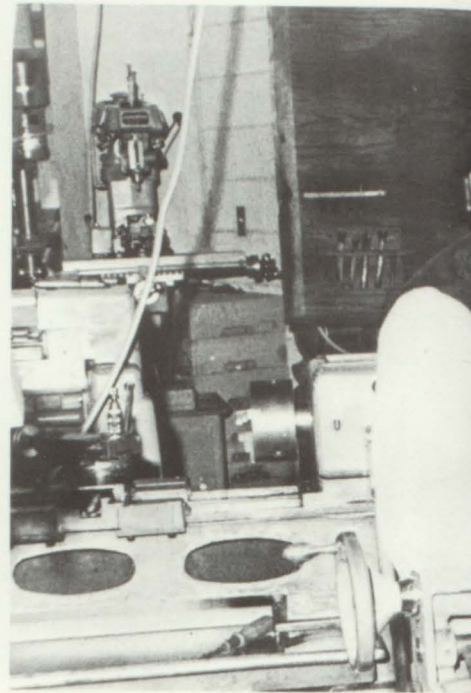
## Pride Grows for Eagle Band in '71

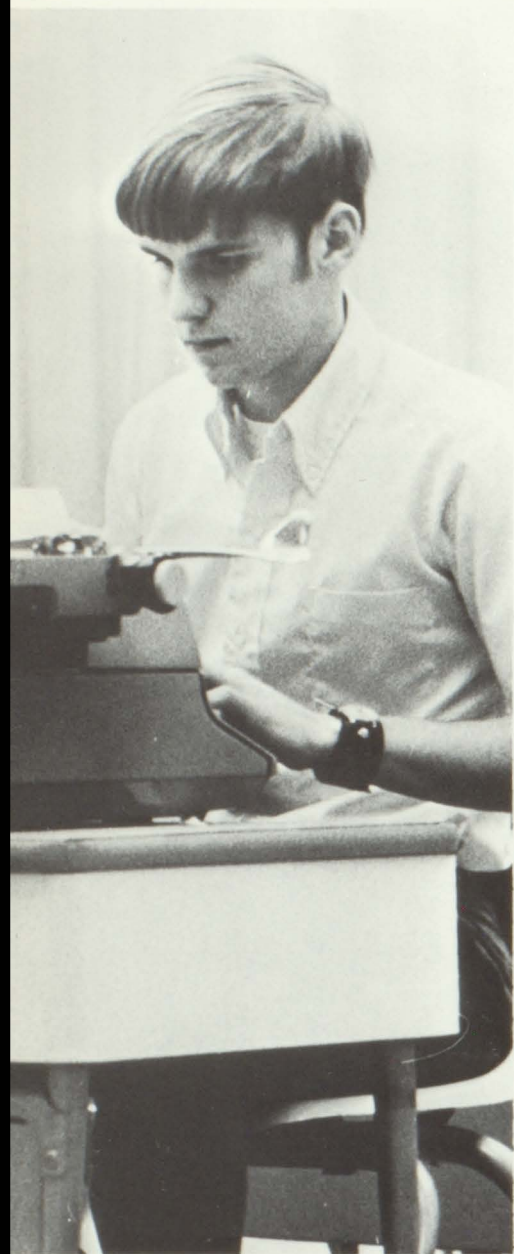

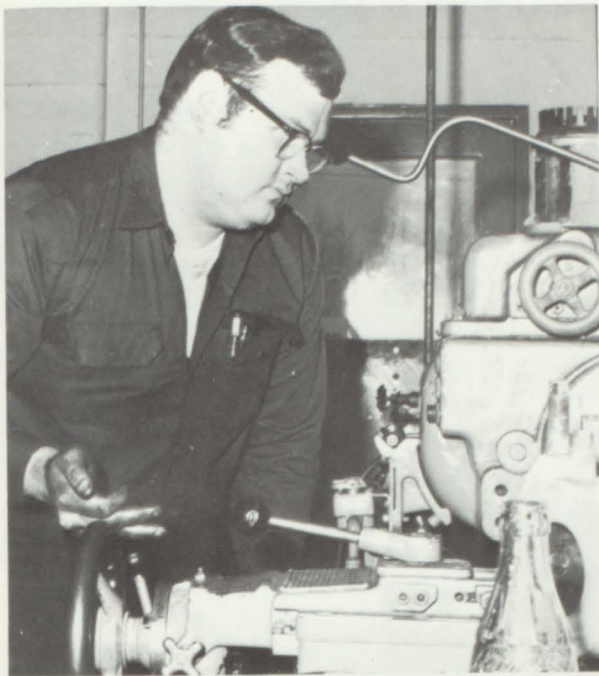

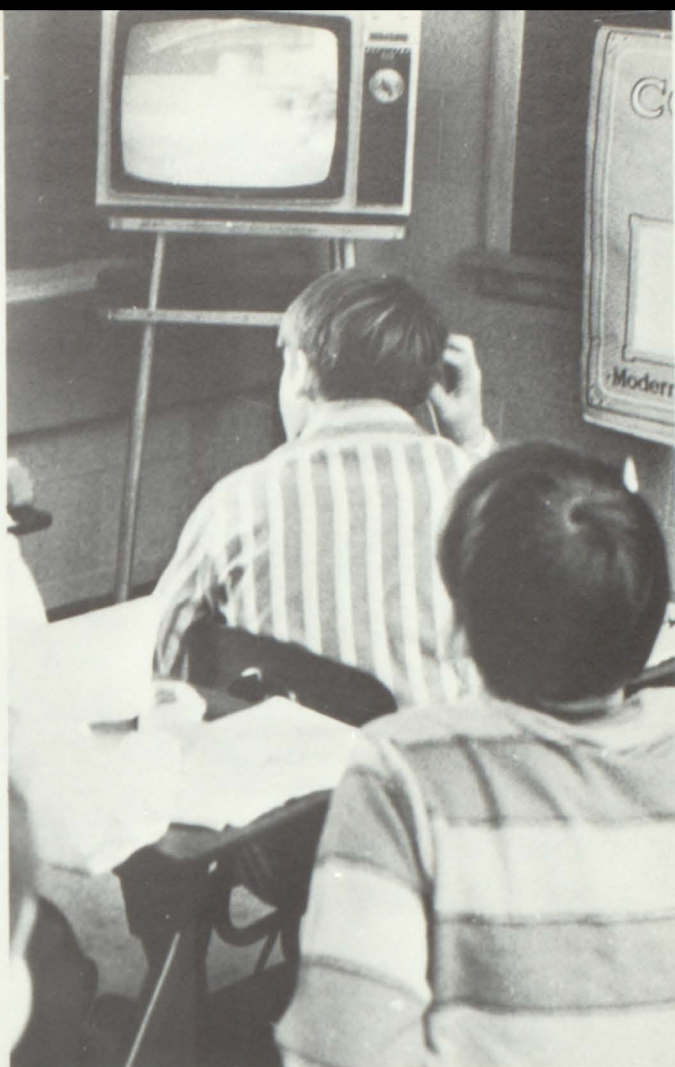

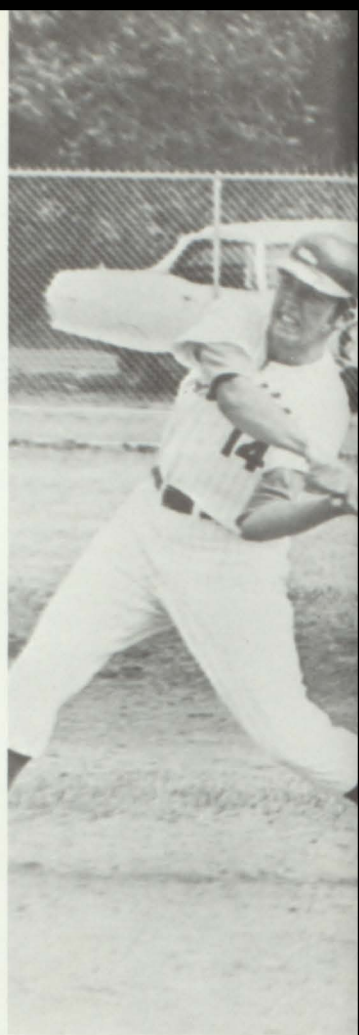

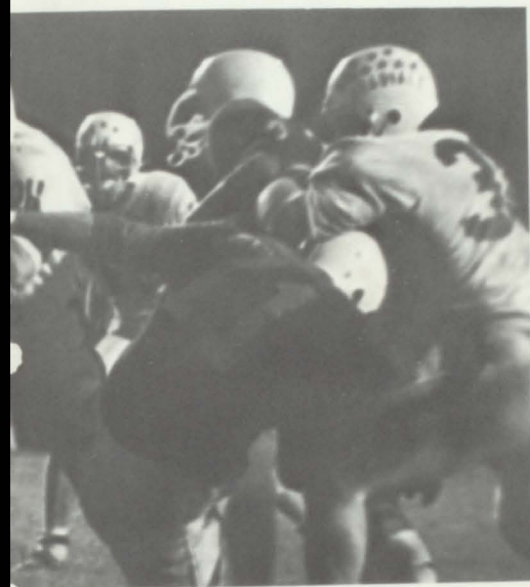

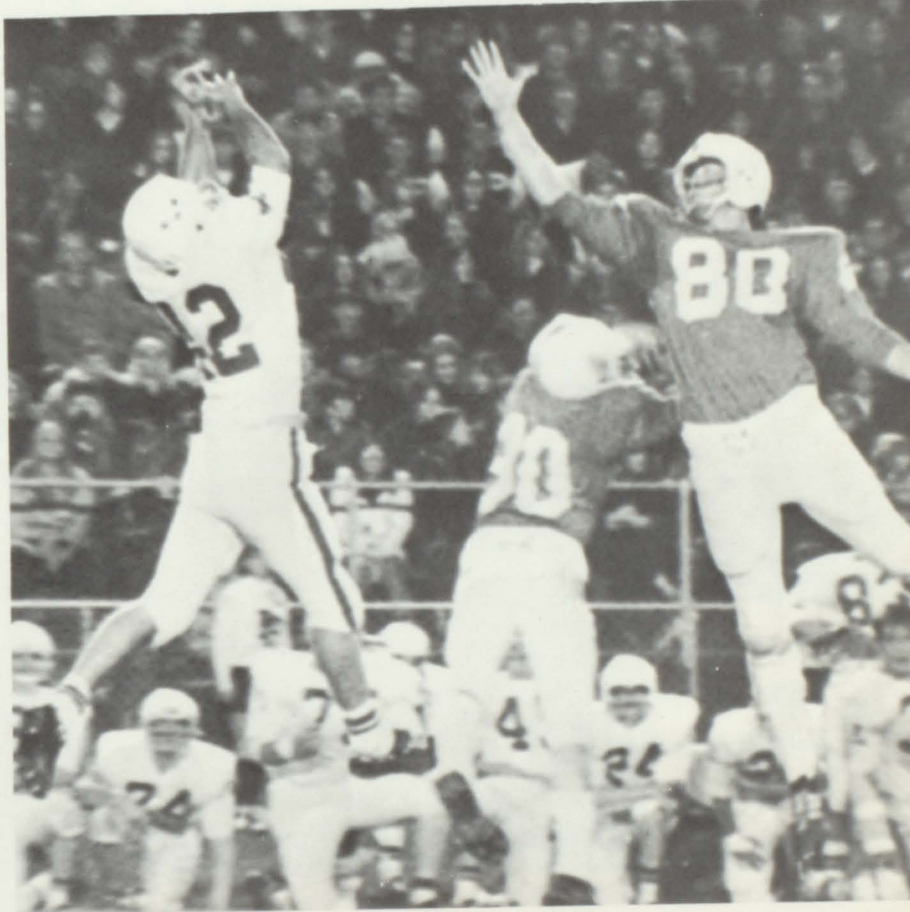

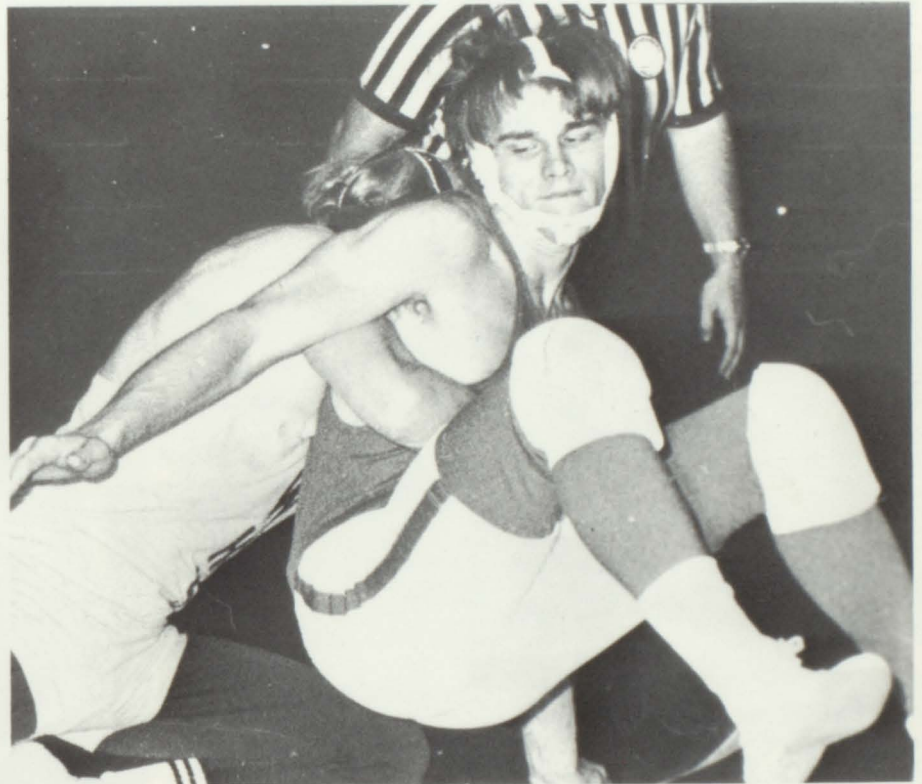

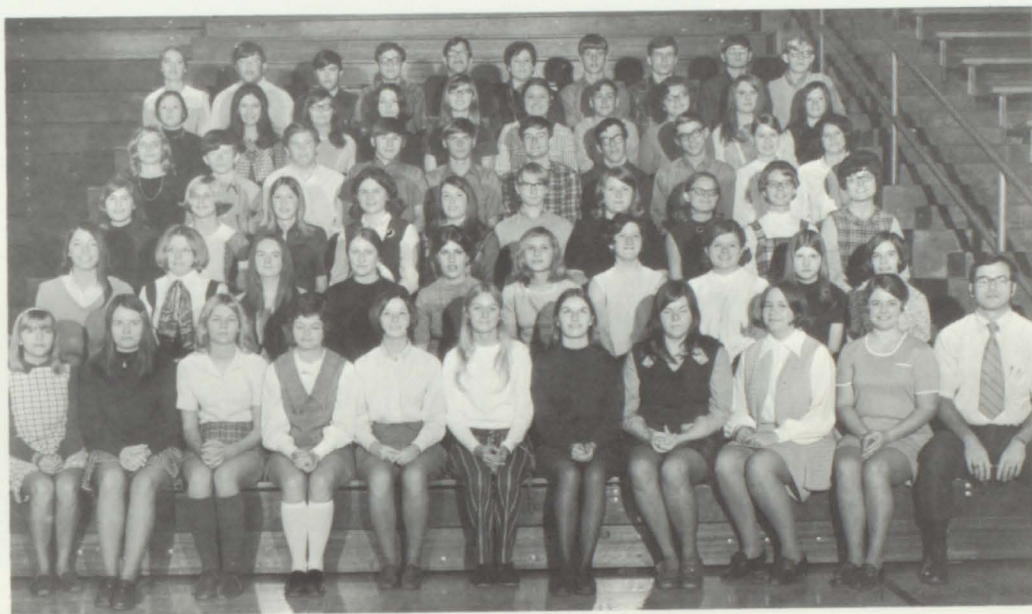
