






Strum on! David Embry sits contentedly on the sophomore float with a guitar in his hands. David was part of the on-float western theme that everyone enjoyed.






Claire Jenness explains to Juan Villamil how to do math during Pre-Calculus. Juan is a foreign exchange student from Columbia that is with us for the year.







For their top half, guys wear a lot of button-down plaid shirts, hoodies, t-shirts, and polo shirts.


For both sexes, shoes are about the same. Tennis shoes, flip-flops, sandals, boots. For the girls, pointy toes are big.

senior girls.








Mattingly, Emily Barr, Craig Betz, Kevin McKeon, Curtis Whitworth, and Juan Villamil.




freshmen followed suit on the tshirt trend. And even though each class made shirts, everyone's was different in some way, but with the same common theme- Go team!

To brush the gray from out your skies and leave them blue;


I'd like to say the kindly things I so oft have heard,



The Class of 2003 has made it to the end. After all these years of hard work **we are graduates**.











Baccalaureate

























The future is looking very bright for this school. For these students support their school wholeheartedly and have fun while doing it. It won't belong until they too will be on the field competing with the larger part of the school.




























Above: Junior highers stretch and prepare to go up against Wes Del.








