It seemed then that time passed so slowly, but now, the class remembers it as only a short time ago.

Our first few days as seventh graders seemed different to us and for a while we were lost in trying to keep up with the upper-classmen. For the first time we were organized with officers and a sponsor. Miss Bredweg was our sponsor for three years. She was replaced by Miss Keever, who was later replaced by Miss Bowers and Mr. Conkling.

It was during the junior year we realized that the end was drawing nearer. We sponsored a donkey basketball game in the fall, and in the spring presented "Peck's Bad Boy" as our class play. We were afraid that the play would be spoiled by an epidemic of the mumps but we got by. The play was a success.

As seniors, we were busy from the time we started to school in the fall until we returned from our trip. We had to order invitations, select cap and gown; we sponsored a skating party, had a market, sponsored the Dixie 4, and a class play, "The Little Dog Laughed". Baccalaureate was held on Sunday May 17., and commencement followed on May 21.
