Senior History

1949 Class History

The class of one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine began its existence with thirty pupils under the direction of Mrs. Kimmerling. For our second grade teacher we had Mrs. Hartley. Our third year class was divided with Mrs. Hartley and Mrs. Adams as teachers. The fourth year was a little confusing to us with morning classes with Mrs. Morris and afternoon classes under Mrs. Wright. The fifth and sixth grade teachers for the class of forty nine were Mrs. Morris and Mrs. Wright respectively.

Our Freshman year had progressed but a few days when out of the blue came "Flunky Week." One whole week of shining shoes, saying the pledge, and other disheartening things we had to do as "green" freshmen. Forty-nine survived the blast of abuse the seniors gave us long enough to elect our class officers for the school year of 1945-46. Our president was Don Cox; vice-president, Ralph Land; secretary, Barbara Lee; treasurer, Richard Fetty; and business manager, Howard Martin.

Our sponsor for the Freshman year was Mrs. Samuels who helped us get started financially as a class. We profited by \$13.33 at the Halloween Festival selling candy.

The Sophomore year found the class of '49 with a new sponsor, Mrs. Saathoff, and an enrollment which was nine less than that of our Freshman year. Our class officers for the year 1946-47 were: President, Mary Joan Duckworth vice-president, George Sprague; secretary, Barbara Hall; and treasurer, Betty Jane Bowers. At the Halloween Festival we sold candy and popcorn and had a fortune telling booth. Our class rings arrived in time to be Christmas presents. We liked them very much, although they did not stay within the class very long, for various reasons.

As Juniors we found that we had a money-making responsibility of keeping the soft drink machines filled for the students at noon and for the public at basketball games. We chose green and white for our class sweaters which have seen plenty of wear during our Junior and Senior years.

For class officers we elected Ralph Land as president; Barbara Lee as secretary and treasurer. Mary Joan Duckworth as vice-president and Phil Sprague as business manager.

Near the close of the semester we had our Junior Class Play. "He Couldn't Marry Five." A three-act comedy under the direction of Mrs. Sharp with Dude Land and Mary Margaret Etchison having leading roles.

Monday, September 13, 1948, brought a happy year to the class of 1949. It was the last lap of our four year race. We, being ambitious students, began the year right by selling ice cream the second day of school. The 16th, we organized our class by electing Ralph Land as president; Howard Martin, vice-president; Mary Margaret Etchison, secretary; Mildred McCord, treasurer, and Gene Surber, business manager. A class meeting was called on September 22, and Barbara Free was elected Editor-in-Chief of the 1949 annual, which the Senior class was to publish.

The week of September 27 was spent in observing one of the oldest traditions of F.H.S. This was the well-remembered Flunky Week. After a week of hectic action and funny sights, school was dismissed for a while Friday, October 1, for the initiation and tug-of-war. We will have to give credit for this year's tug to the Sophomores and the power of numbers. As Flunky Week drew to a close we elected the Eaglite Staff.

Jesse Greene from the L. G. Balfour Company, met with us on September 28th to take orders for our name cards and graduation invitations.

On September 29, Mrs Sharp held try-outs for the play cast for which ten members were chosen. After five weeks of intensive practice the play was presented on November 19.

On October 5, we started our advertising campaign to finance the "Eaglite." After two weeks of hard work we had almost finished this part.

On October 6, we took a school bus to Anderson and Elite Studios where Mr. Russell Forkner took our senior pictures. We received our proofs on October 11, and almost everyone was very well satisfied with them.

The annual Halloween Festival was held October 29, in the gym. Our class was very much in evidence with our cake walk and Dick Fetty on the microphone.

On December 3, we voted on the girl member of our class who was to receive the D.A.R. award. This award, which is given by the Daughters of the American Revolution, goes to the girl whom the class votes the best citizen for our four years in high school. Many things are considered in this including citizenship, interest in the class and scholastic average. On the 13th we were happy to learn that Barbara Free received this honor.

Another stage in the game was reached on December 17, when the school was dismissed for the Christmas holidays. It was then the Seniors finally began to realize how nearly our high school days were over.

We returned from vacation on January 3, 1949, full of Christmas candy and turkey, to find that we were faced with semester exams. However, we all came through with flying colors and were ready to start our last semester in good old F. H. S.

On February 14, we finished the work on the annual and sent the final proofs to the printer. We were very glad to have the job finished and felt as if we had worked hard on it. We received the finished book on May 1 and found that it sold very well. We hope that the annual will become a tradition with the classes of Frankton High School.

The first event in the observance of Senior Week was the Baccalaureate service in the Gymnasium. Reverend Otto C. Stroup delivered the address. We were then ready for our final week of high school.

Our Commencement services were on the evening of May 20. We received our diplomas and were officially graduated.

We spent the next nine days viewing the sights of the big cities on our eastern trip.

Senior Prophecy

CLASS PROPHECY OF 1949

While talking to Dr. Kirk they learned that he and Wanda Brad-dick had married and were the parents of three children.

While on their way out of town a large farm caught their eyes. Or maybe the sign on the barn was what drew their attention. It was Fetty's White Face Dairy. A large herd of cattle could be seen in the broad green pastures. They spent the night with the Fetty's and at noon the next day they were in Wichita, Kansas.

Looking up the street in Wichita they saw a procession of trucks. One truck driver was Walter Skillman who owned a nine-hundred acre farm, and they were stopping for dinner in town before returning to the fields.

Walter invited them to the farm for the afternoon. He told them they might also see David Singer, his neighbor, who also owned a wheat farm. Both had proved to be very successful farmers.

The following day they were in Denver, Colorado. They were strolling down the street inspecting the city when a lady of about thirty-eight stopped them and introduced herself as the former Norma Dwiggens. She invited them to her home for dinner. 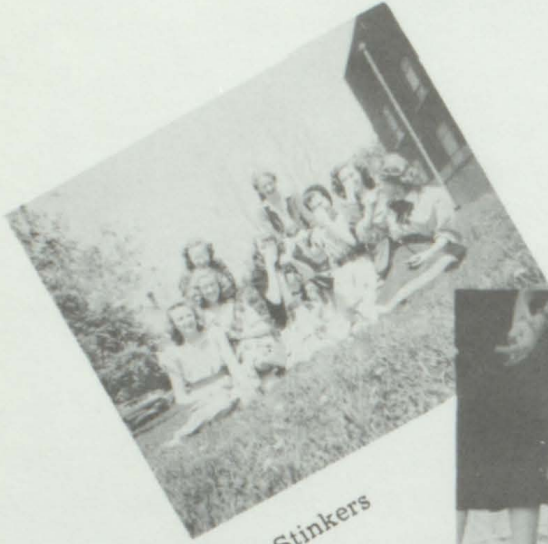

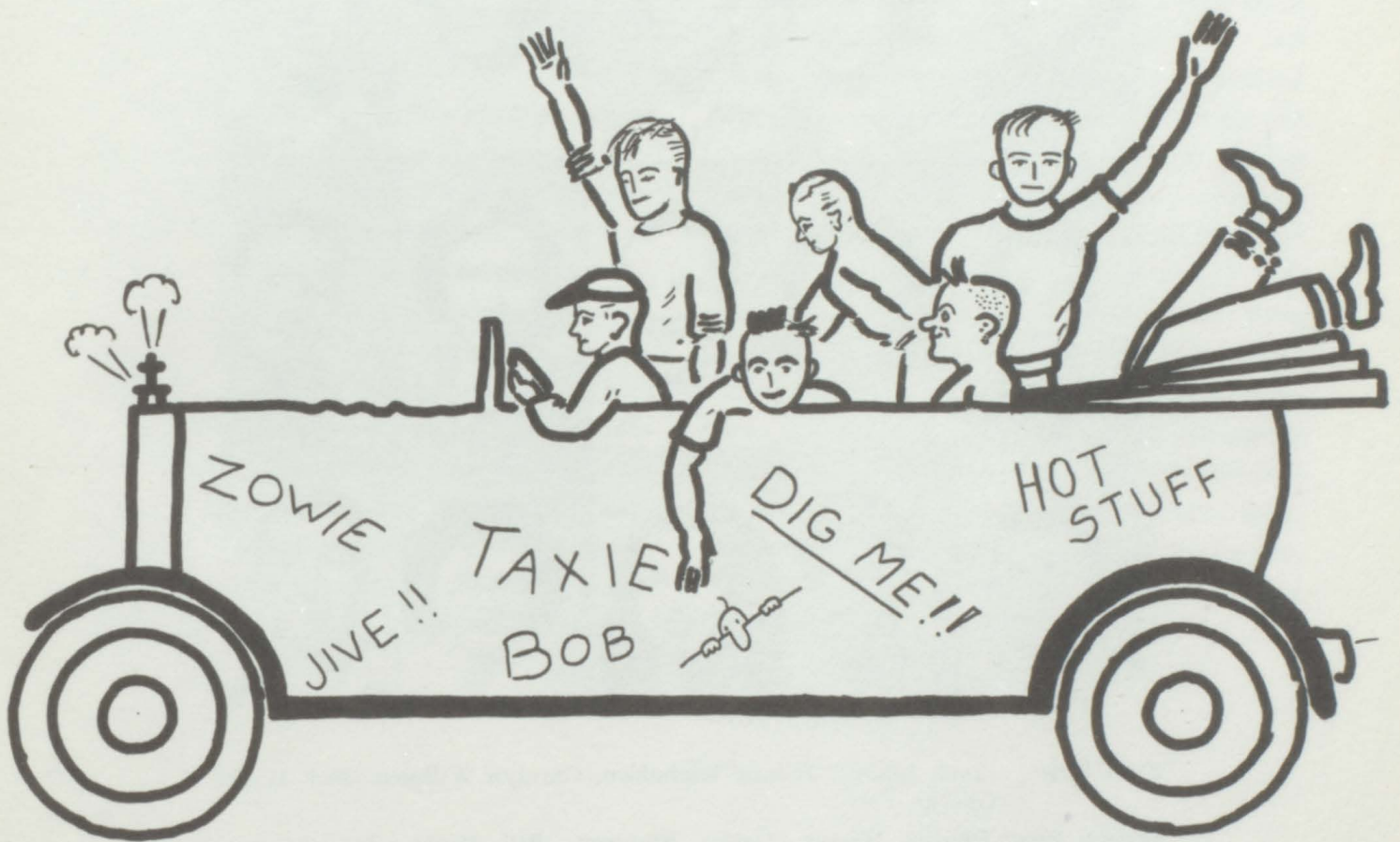

We elected the following officers: Carol Benson, president; Bob Morgan, vice-president; Mary Lou Frank, treasurer; Jeanne Nicholson, secretary. Mr. Twiford was our sponsor. We sponsored the spook house and sold pie and candy at the Halloween Festival.

As we graduated from the so-called "green year," we entered F. H. S. as sophomores. During the summer we lost quite a few students and entered the '47-'48 term with thirty-four members.
