## Class History

The class of 1957 began its existence with forty-four pupils under the direction of Mrs. Kimmerling. For our second grade teacher, we had Mrs. Hughes. Our fifth and sixth grade teachers for the class of ' 57 were Miss Howard and Mrs. Wright respectively.

As a class activity in the sixth grade, we had a paper drive to start our financial goal. In the seventh grade we sold pencils as our means of making money. In the eighth grade our project was selling Christmas cards to the public.

Our officers in our Freshman year were president, Bill Friend; vice-president, Ruth Windsor; secretary, Carolyn Wimer; treasurer, Paul Lennon, and the business manager, Roger Dickinson.

Our sponsors for the Freshman year were Miss Dreger and Mr. Hunter.
The Sophomore year found the class of 57 with the same sponsors and the class officers were president, Bill Friend; vice-president, Ruth Windsor; secretary, Kay Kallner; treasurer, Paul Lennon, and the business manager; Roger Dickinson. Our class rings arrived near the Thanksgiving season. We liked them very much. Also, they didn't stay within the class very long, for various reasons.

As Juniors we found that we had a money making responsibility of keeping the pop machines filled for the students at noon and for the public at the basketball games.

We chose turquoise and white for our class sweaters which have seen plenty of wear during our Junior and Senior years.

As our class officers, we elected president, Bill Friend; vice-president, Tom Lee; secretary, Kay Kallner; treasurer, Paul Lennon, and the business manager, Max Zent.

Near the close of the semester we had our Junior Class Play, "It's a Great Life," a three act comedy under the direction of Mr. Nash.

Tuesday, September 4, 1956, brought a happy year to the class of 157. It was the last lap of our four year race. We, being ambitious students, began the year right by selling ice cream the first day of school. Our class officers were president, Roger Dickinson; vice-president, Bill Friend; secretary, Kay Kallner; treasurer, Paul Lennon, and the business manager, Merrill Metcalfe.

Jesse Greene from the L. G. Balfour Company met with us on September 6, to take orders for our name cards and graduation announcements.

On October 1, we started our advertising campaign to finance the "EAGLITE". After one month of hard work, we had finished this part.

Russell Forkner of the Elite Studios asked that our pictures be taken between October 10 and November 11 .

The annual Halloween Festival was held Octobes 31, in the gym. Our class was very much in evidence with our cake walk, Musicalities, and the nail driving contest.

We had a fish fry during the fall, and the girl members of our class acted as hostesses at a dinner sponsored by the local civic group.

We voted on the girl member of our class who was to receive the DAR award. The award, which is given by the Daughters of the American Revolution goes to the girl whom the class votes the best citizen for our four years in high school. Many things are considered in this including citizenship, interest in the class and scholastic average. We were happy to learn that Linda Drake received this honor.

Another stage in events was reached on December 21, when the school was dismissed for the Christmas holidays. It was then the Seniors finally began to realize how nearly our high school days were over.

We returned from vacation January 2, 1957, full of Christmas candy and turkey, to find that we were faced with semester exams. However, we all came through with flying colors and were ready to start our last semester in good old F.H.S.

On February 13, we finished the work on the annual and sent the final proofs to the printer. We were very glad to have the job finished and felt as if we had worked hard on it. We received the finished book in April and found that it had sold very well.

April 13, we left on our long-awaited Senior trip to Washington, D. C., New York, West Point and other points of interest. We toured on two Miller Tours buses. We returned tired but happy on April 21.

We presented our class play "Hotheaded Herbert," a comedy on April 11 and 12, which proved to be very successful.

Baccalaureate service was held in the gymnasium. Reverend Otto C. Stroup delivered the address, We were then ready for our final week of high school.

Our Commencement services were on the evening of May 23. We received our diplomas and were officially graduated.
