





During one of our many convocations the Spurr team gave us a swinging exhibition of their musical talents.


About once every two weeks the teachers come together to discuss the many problems that always manage to pop up from time to time.








# Your Honor Society




#### Student Teachers






The club directed a tour of the science labs during the annual homecoming. They have been using two bulletin boards in the front hall for science displays to advance interest in science.










