
and the Man."







#### New Honor Society Replaces NHS




After the homecoming win, bad luck came to town. The Eagles came up on the short end against Highland, Ham. Hts., Wes-Del, and Tri-Central.





#### Cross Country Trudges On




The Eagles won the first game in the sectional against Lapel, a team who had beaten them, then lost in two games to Highland.





Eric Hudson was named team Captain and Steve Marsh was named MVP of the squad.














### Cheerleaders Cheer On


Varsity and reserve cheerleading elections are held in the spring of the school year, and the girls are elected by an allschool vote of the student body.


















#### Eagles Tie for 2nd in Track WRC Tourney






















#### Golfers Paced by Young Squad


## Anderson Victory Highlights Spring Season




