Basketball practice next year will definitely rearrange!



Homecoming Day






The seniors were the favored to win the annual Powder Puff game, but I guess that didn't affect the juniors.

Homecoming Night


Homecoming night began with the traditional Homecoming Parade with Mr. VanBuskirkand family as Grand Marshals.

The Eagles won 41-32 with an offense controlled by Joey Mahoney, John Collier, Arik Flanders and Matt Boyland.



Frankton Fire

On March 12, 2001 Frankton Jr. Sr. High School suffered a seven alarm fire. Fire departments from most neighboring towns rushed to the rescue in the early morning hours. The fire was the result of the second burglary this year at FJSHS. The severe fire was contained to the newlyremodeled main office. After smoke and water damage, the result was a bill of 2,300,000 dollars. The next month was spent with over a hundred persons working long hoursto clean and repair our school. The hallways closest to the office were carpeted along with the library. They also replaced the ceiling and installed new lighting. There were 1100 gallons of fresh paint used to help cover the smell and water damage.

Because of damages to the intercom and fire detector systems students were relocated. High school students were moved to Lapel until spring break. Lapel students went to school from 7:50 a.m. to noon. Then, at noon Frankton students used the empty class rooms to learn until 4:30 P.M.. Mr. Speicher sent a

Through this tragedy everyone has remained light hearted and in good spirits.

Magical Prom Night







While on their trip they visited Mount Vernon, Gettysburg and the Washington, Lincoln, Jefferson, and Roosevelt memorials.


The class also visited Arlington National Cemetery where Katie Betz and Joel Beardsley presented a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

While in Washington, the students talked to Mike Pence, who is the U.S. Representative for our district.







Style has changed dramatically. Hair was an array of teasing and crimping in the 1980's. Now, it is soft for girls and spiky for boys.






















