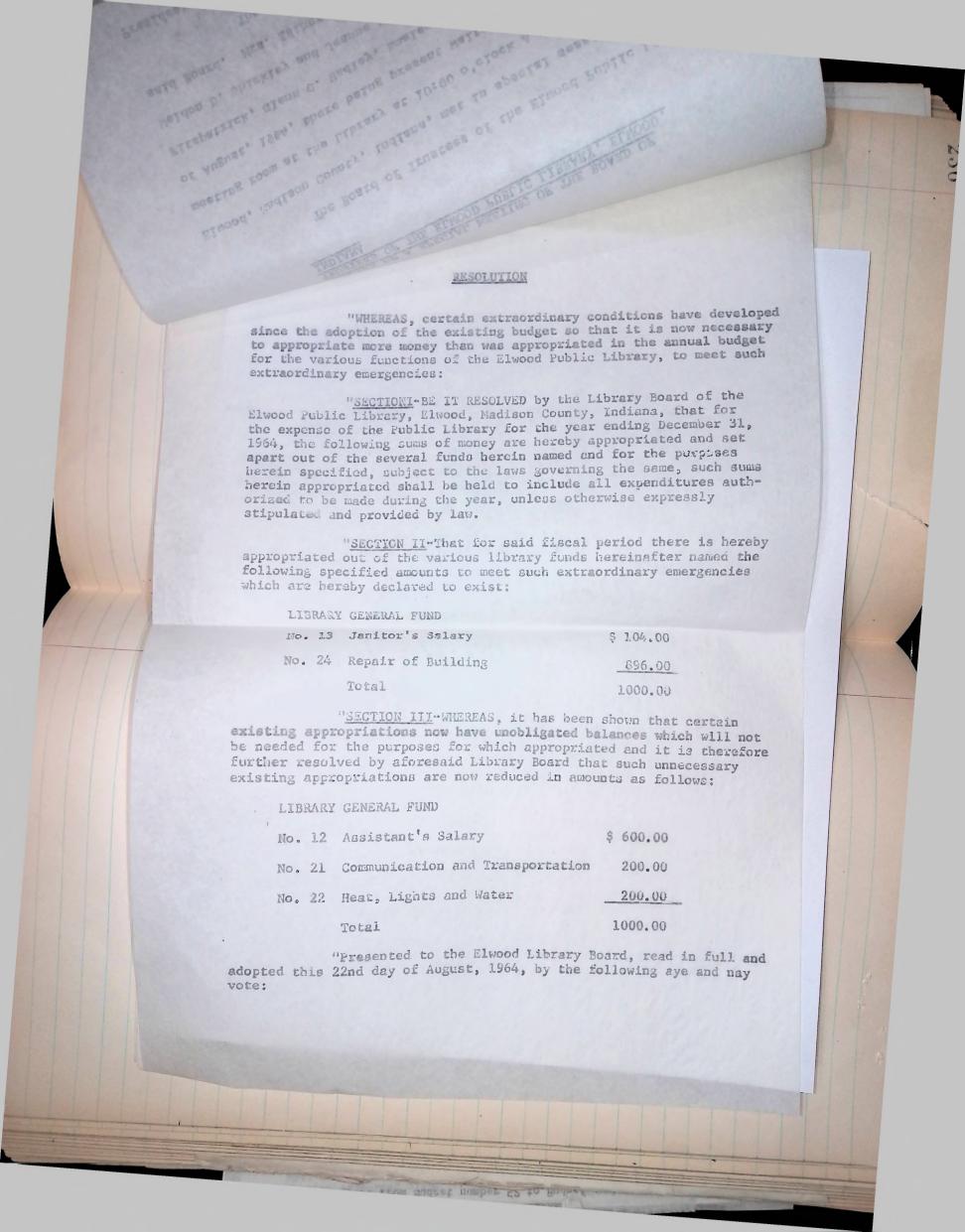

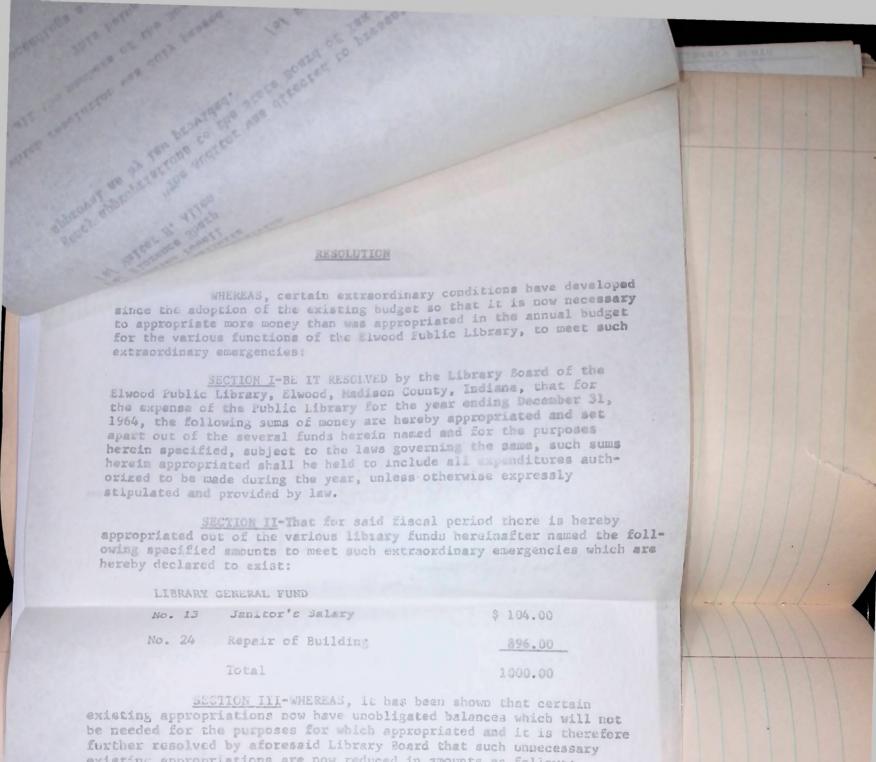
The meeting was called to order by Emalee Powell, President, who presided.

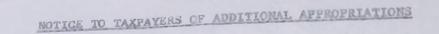

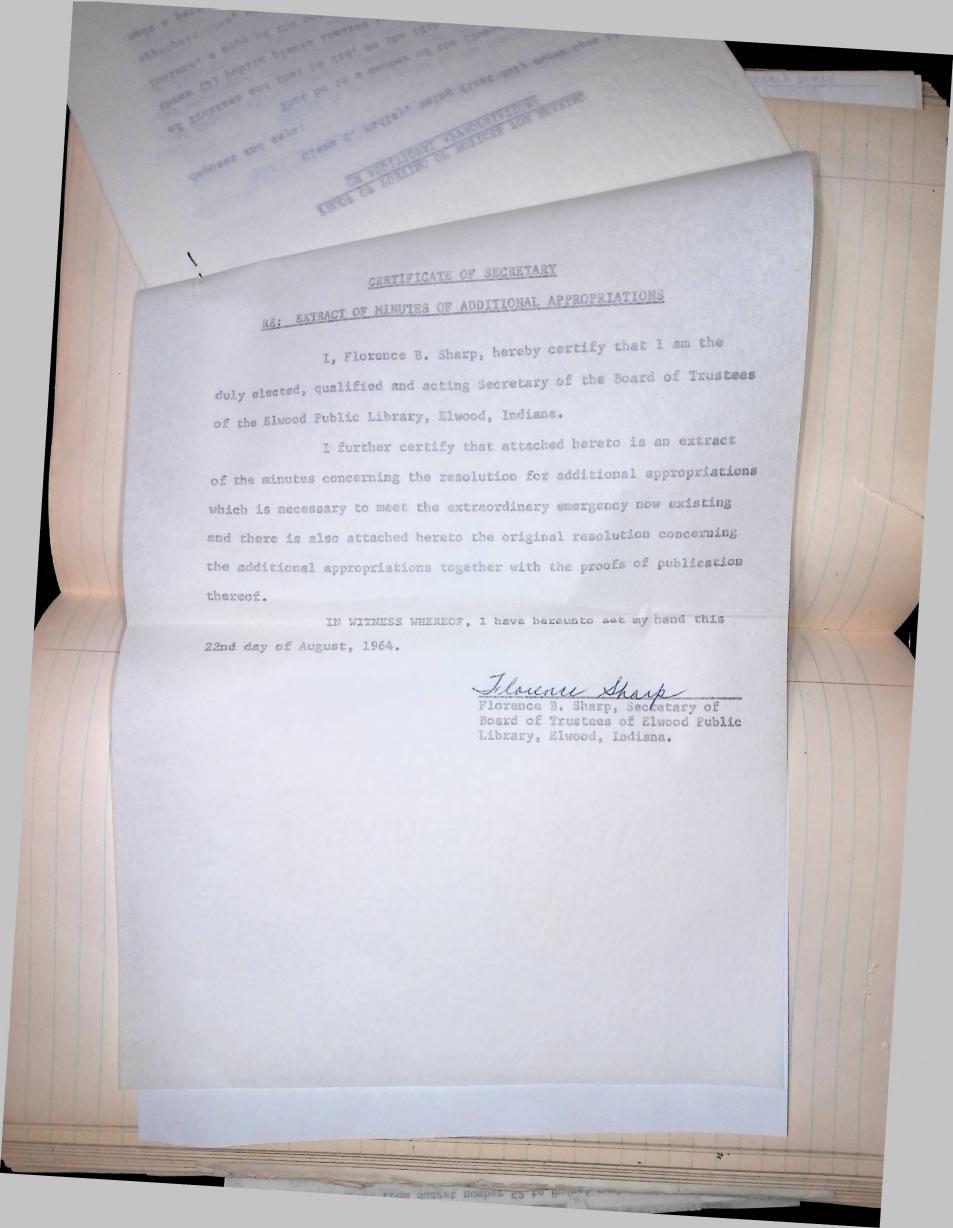
